

The **City of Cuyahoga Falls** in Ohio recently installed a HVAC energy management system in its City Hall. The 65,000-square-foot building, built in 1952, previously had HVAC systems that ran 24 hours a day. Mayor Don L. Robart put together a team that included Comse Energy Managers, a subsidiary of Ohio Edison Company and also a Rebuild America partner. According to Project Engineer George Locher, Jr., “We’re already seeing that our estimated annual savings of \$13,000 are on target. The City will recoup its investment in two and a half years.”
